

Questionnaire to Readers of the Indian Historical Review

- Q. What do the readers feel about the academic standard of the IHR? Where does it stand in comparison to other reputed journals like Studies in History and IESHR?
- Q. In its present format the IHR carries about 10 articles/review articles and 20 book reviews. Are the readers happy with this format? If not, what changes are suggested?
- Q. Will it be advisable to publish in the IHR additional information for the benefit of professional historians (like announcement of conferences, travel grants, etc.) apart from articles and book reviews?
- Q. Would it be advisable to publish the IHR on a quarterly basis rather than its present bi-annual schedule?
- Q. Presently the IHR focuses more on the publication of general volumes that include articles on a variety of themes covering different time periods; thematic numbers are published only occasionally. Would the readers like to have more of thematic issues of the IHR?
- Q. Are the readers happy with the overall production quality of the IHR?
- Q. If not, what changes are suggested to improve the overall get-up of the IHR?
- Q. Each single issue of the IHR is priced at Rs. 100 for individuals and Rs. 200 for institutions. This price has remained constant for nearly a decade. What do readers feel about the idea of raising the price of the IHR to Rs. 200/- per issue in the case of individuals and Rs. 400/- in the case of institutions?
